Vocabulary/Spelling/Poetry (10–12)

■ In-depth vocabulary study

For each vocabulary word, the following information is given: syllabication, pronunciation, part of speech, etymology, definition, sentence example, synonyms, antonyms, and related forms. The exercises are the kind that are very closely related to reading comprehension. The vocabulary words are not odd words, but words from great literature and general reading that secondary level (grades 7–12) students need to learn in order to read with understanding.

■ Analytical skills

Each textbook contains a convenient Word Analyzer made up of Greek and Latin prefixes, suffixes, and roots. If one knows these word parts, he can determine the meaning of thousands of new words without having to look them up. Every lesson gives the student practice in using the Word Analyzer.

■ Reasoning skills

To help students sharpen their reasoning ability, each book features a series of verbal analogies. Most of the analogies in these books contain the vocabulary words, synonyms, and antonyms taught in previous lessons. Therefore, the students are not only learning how to recognize relationships but also reviewing their vocabulary words.

■ Carefully compiled spelling lists

The spelling words in the first few lessons illustrate the “Four Spelling Rules to Master” at the front of the book. The rest of the words are from lists of the most troublesome words. In these lists, the words that follow any of the four spelling rules are identified so that the learning of the spelling rules is reinforced. Mastery of the lists of words in these textbooks will eliminate most of a student’s spelling difficulties and will make him more effective in his writing. In place of spelling words, the twelfth-grade book gives word histories.

■ Inspiring poetry selections to keep for a lifetime

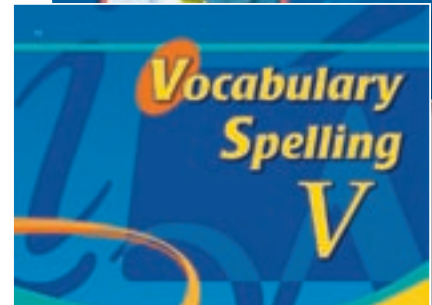

■ Helpful Teacher Keys

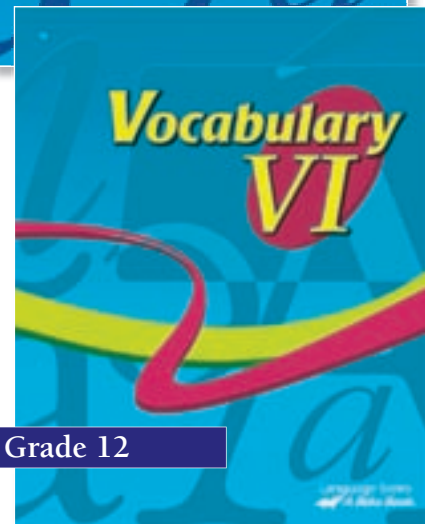
